National Education Union - strike action for teachers

5 July 7 July

As you may have seen, the National Education Union (NEU) has confirmed that their teaching members will be taking industrial action in the form of strike days, the next dates scheduled are Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July.

This action is not against Outwood Academy Adwick itself but is part of national industrial action organised by the trade unions about salary negotiations with the Department for Education.

Neither the Outwood Grange Academies Trust Board nor myself as Principal are legally allowed to close the academy in sympathy with the strike, and we will not do so. However, our main concern is the health and safety of our students. The academy will only close (partially or fully) if, in our opinion and following a full risk assessment, it is not safe to remain open.

Due to the number of staff taking action, we have made the difficult decision to close the academy on Wednesday 5th July and Friday 7th July to all students apart from Year 10 and Year 12 who will be expected to attend as normal, with the exception of any vulnerable students who can attend as normal. Vulnerable students are defined as Looked after Children, Children in Need, Child Protection and students with an Education Health and Care Plan. All vulnerable children in the categories above are expected to attend as usual.

Whilst the academy will be closed to some students, online learning via Google Classroom will be available to all students and students will be expected to complete the work set.

Free School Meals

Students in all year groups in receipt of free school meals are entitled to request and collect a meal for the day consisting of a sandwich, dessert and a drink. Alternatively parents may request for their child to attend the academy for a hot-meal. Based on numbers accessing this provision we will share a half-hour dining slot which they can attend. All students accessing this provision will be expected to wear full academy uniform. Requests can be made by completing the form below:

For students in Year 10 and 12; the academy will be open as normal and students should arrive ready by 8:15 am for the usual 8.25 am start.

Vulnerable students are expected to attend the academy as normal. (Looked after Children, Children

as academic studies, with close support from our Inclusion team. Activities will include; food & catering skills, sports & fitness sessions, literacy & numeracy skills and Google classroom activities.

The usual lunch provisions will be available.
