Whilst we are proud of academic excellence, we aspire to be much more, a school is a community and a school must have a heart, and we strongly believe that our culture should be about celebrating individual effort and becoming safe, responsible and respectful young people who help each other to go beyond their potential.

Your child may have informed you that we recently carried out student surveys, as we always want to hear their opinions and concerns, especially in respect of being safe, respectful and responsible. We will go into the next half-term responding to their answers and continuing to create a community that everyone would want to belong to.

This first half-term has set us excellent foundations to build on and we look forward to a wealth of upcoming community events in the lead up to Christmas. The items below will support us in ensuring students meet our high standards and expectations, so that our full focus can be on great teaching and learning, and a positive experience for everyone at the academy.

### **Food vouchers and Household Support Fund**

We and the local authority recognise that we remain in challenging times, with rising food and energy costs and undue hardship. We have a duty to support our most vulnerable families within our community. Where before food vouchers were provided through school holidays for students in receipt of free school meals, Doncaster Council will replace this service with single payment to support food and energy costs. This payment will be based on individual families benefits entitlement and number of people / dependents within the household.

### **Attendance and Punctuality**

It has been fantastic to see the rise in student attendance to the academy, post Covid. We strive for all students to have excellent attendance, at least 95%+, as research proves that there is understandably a direct correlation between good attendance and excellent academic outcomes. It was great last week to celebrate such a high percentage of students being rewarded for 100% attendance, and we hope to see the same over the next half-term.

In regards to punctuality, all students must be on-site by 08:15, in readiness for students moving to lessons at 08:20 and lessons underway by 08:25. We are aware of the changes to the public bus services which many students are reliant on. For the vast majority this has not affected punctuality, but we have shared our views and challenges with the service providers and the local authority so that we voice the community's concerns and support our students, especially as we head into the darker mornings.

### **Enrichment**

Over the last half-term we have launched an extensive enrichment programme, with academic, creative and sports clubs running from 14:30 - 15:30, all free of charge. The sessions are inclusive to everyone at the academy. Please support your child in attending enrichment as it is an excellent opportunity to try something new, develop skills and work with others outside of the classroom and our regular curriculum. We're always listening to students' ideas for clubs. There is also no commitment to sign up for any length of time (unless Year 11 targeted sessions), and students may try as many as they like by simply arriving at the session.

## Uniform and Equipment

We pride ourselves on the standards of academy uniform, as students look extremely smart and wear their uniform with pride in the community. We also ensure they have the correct equipment as part of our 'being responsible' values.

Please, support your child in being prepared for the next half-term with a few key reminders that we're really focussing on.

- As the weather changes, the uniform policy permits a **plain black v-neck jumper** underneath blazers. This must not be branded (with exception to the Outwood logo) and strictly hoodies and sweatshirts are not permitted.
- We have seen a significant increase in the number of students requiring to borrow a **school tie**. It is the students responsibility to have a school tie.
- **Skirts** must be an academy uniform skirt, with the OGAT logo and should not be rolled or modified in any way.

If a student does not have an element of the school uniform they should attend the Student Information Desk (SID) before the start of the school day. They will be able to borrow an item of uniform, a C4 sanction will be given, but then removed when they return the uniform item at the end of the day.

## Jewellery

- Items such as earrings, nose studs, rings, bracelets, necklaces and other jewellery (including clear inserts) are not allowed for health and safety and will be confiscated if seen. The first time jewellery is confiscated it may be collected by the student at the end of the day, if confiscated for a second time it must be collected by an adult.
- Make-up must be very discrete, eyebrows of normal shape and colour, fake eyelashes are not allowed and students will be expected to remove them.
- No nail varnish or false nails

## Equipment

- Students must have their **academy planner** with them throughout the academy day. It is a key resource for accessing lessons as it includes their whiteboard, coloured response cards, timetable, diary for recording information, individual subject resources and much more. If a student forgets their planner they will be provided with a temporary 1 day planner for that day and a C4 sanction issued. If this becomes a persistent issue and/or the planner is lost, parents will be expected to purchase a new planner.
- All students must have a **school bag** as part of their uniform expectations. It should be large enough to fit an A4 folder, their PE kit and basic equipment.
