It's been a busy Summer Term this year. Let's recap the highlights!

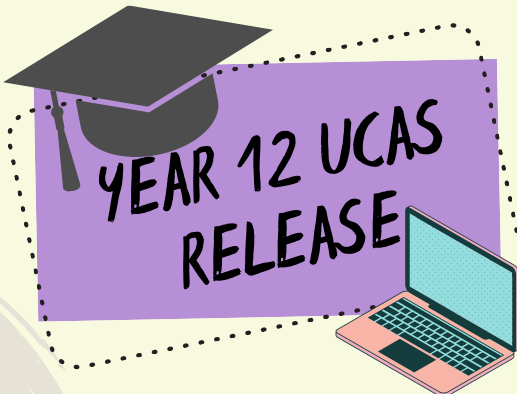
OGAT PERFORMER OF THE YEAR

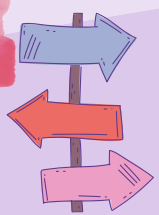

We had a brilliant morning celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III in May!

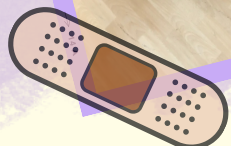
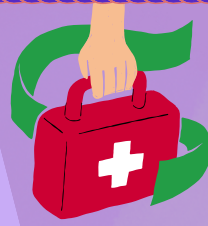
Our Post 16 students had an afternoon tea style celebration, and Mr Tweedale hosted a royal-themed quiz to celebrate the historic event!




WORK EXPERIENCE WEEK



Students attended placements ranging from working in local Primary Schools, residential homes, and accountancy firms, to car garages, nurseries and even a Chartered Surveying company!


Here's a few comments from some of our students about how the week went...

Congratulations to our Class of 2023 who achieved fantastic results in their Level 3 qualifications this summer!

Despite the disruption to their GCSE years due to the pandemic, students entered post-16 education with a fantastic work ethic and A-Level results day marked the culmination of their efforts.
