All students at Outwood Academy Adwick have access to a wide range of careers provisions that include independent, impartial advice and guidance relating to their options at school and how these may affect their career pathways. This aims to provide students with the knowledge, inspiration and ability to take ownership of their futures.

- **Futures Fair** Our Futures Fair invites colleges, university, apprenticeship and training providers to join us for an event where students can explore the options available for them after Year 11 and Year 13.
- Careers Life Lessons (Y7-10) All students will have designated life lessons centred around careers. In these sessions students will identify their skills and interests and enable them to build confidence in researching future career opportunities and build action plans to work towards these goals. These lessons will look at challenging workplace stereotypes and highlight the broad range of opportunities available to students after Year 11, including apprenticeships, college, A Levels, degree apprenticeships and university.
  - KS3: Students gain an understanding of the world of work, career preparation, equal opportunities and the importance of developing their skill set. They explore the choices that their subjects within school will offer them and help to prepare students for their Y10 pathway choices.
  - KS4: Students build on the knowledge and understanding of careers they have gained in KS3. Career preparation in the form of CV's, covering letters, personal specifications, the interview process and the importance of how you should present yourself on your first day at work are all covered in detail. Students are also introduced to the social and moral aspects of careers, discussing gender stereotypes, equal training opportunities, work life balance and worker and employer rights. Furthermore, career pathways such as post-16, college opportunities, apprenticeships, university and adult education are all discussed in more detail.
- **Tutor Programme** Students have designated time in tutorial sessions relating to careers. Students explore a wide variety of jobs and the skills and qualifications required for them. Students are regularly exposed to local labour market information to enable them to make informed choices for future pathways.
- **Guidance Sessions (Post 16)** Students in our 6th form receive weekly guidance sessions. As part of this provision students focus on many aspects of further education and careers preparation. This includes mock interviews with their tutors, UCAS sessions, information regarding the opportunities available on results day and finance. Students who do not wish to pursue a university pathway spend dedicated time exploring employment opportunities and other routes when leaving 6th form. Students work with local agencies to support this process.
- **FutureFit** All students will access videos based on careers within the curriculum. These videos are embedded within the curriculum for each year group. The sessions will give students real life insight into careers that link into the subjects that they are studying.
- **HeppSY (Y10-Y13)** Students benefit from a range of talks and workshops relating to the possibilities of higher education. This is to equip students with the knowledge of how higher education works, the benefits and how to make the right decision.
- Careers Cafes Students will be provided with the opportunity to meet local organisations from a range of sectors in order to find out information and ask questions. These informal drop in sessions take place at lunchtimes throughout the year. Student voice is consulted regularly so that providers are sectors that students are interested in and want to find out more information about.
- **Local Information Website** All students, parents/carers and staff have access to our <u>bespoke careers website</u>. This contains local information to provide students with the range of local providers. It also provides parents/carers with advice on how to support their child when making decisions about their future.

• Each year group will have additional experiences as stated below to ensure that they have the opportunity for meaningful encounters with employers every academic year. Additional events will be provided throughout the year in addition to those below.
